Overview

RIVERSPORT is hosting 2024 Olympic Team Trials for two disciplines: Canoe/Kayak Slalom and Kayak Cross. 50-100 athletes from across the US will vie for the opportunity to compete at the Paris Games in July.

Canoe or Kayak?

"Canoe/Kayak" designates the two types of boats used in their respective events. Athletes kneel in a canoe and use a single-bladed paddle. Kayakers sit in their boats and use a double-bladed paddle.

Slalom racing takes paddlers down the channels through a series of gates; green gates are downstream and red gates require the athlete to paddle upstream. Athletes compete for time, and penalties are levied if a gate is missed or touched.

Kayak Cross is new to the Olympic Games and will debut in Paris. Athletes launch their boats from a platform 10 feet above the water, side-by-side with three other competitors. They splash into the water and jostle for position down the channel as they paddle through gates and complete a 360 degree roll. Unlike other paddlesports, contact is allowed.

- Opened May 2016 \$45.2M project
- Built with a one-cent sales tax as part of the city's MAPS 3 (Metropolitan Area Projects) initiative. Other MAPS projects in the city include...

RIVERSPORT Course Design & Stats

- Designed by Scott Shipley, S2O Design 5x Kayak Slalom World Champion
- Construction 15 months to complete
- Competition Channel is 1,300 feet Recreation Channel is 1,600 feet
- 8 million gallons of water 6 recirculating pumps create Class II-IV rapids
- Each pump circulates 82,000 gallons per minute a total of 492,000 gallons per minute. With these pumps, it would take 80 seconds to fill an Olympic size swimming pool
- 11-acre course features the world's highest-volume pumped channel, running at 1,200 to 1,400 cubic feet per second at full capacity
